UCAS Form for NCSC and ICCE graduates

If you are a NCSC graduate, enter your details under 'Other (UK Qualifications)', which can be foundunder 'O' in the alphabetical list of all qualifications in Apply (as are 'Other (International EU Qualifications)' and 'Other (International Non-EU Qualifications)' depending on which best fits the applicant). These qualifications are all free text fields, so the student can enter all details as required with no restrictions.

If you are an ICCE graduate, enter your details under 'Other (International non-EU Qualifications)'.

If you are stuck on the 'add school, college or centre' section:

In the 'Education' section of the form, click on the 'add new school/college/centre' link. In the new page that appears for you to enter the details of the school, you will see that the 'school/college/centre name' section is greyed out. You need to click on the 'Find' button to the right of this line. This will open a new window with a search bar. You need to search for something (anything at all will be fine), then a page will load which includes a link that says 'My school/centre isnot listed here'. If you click on this, it will close the window and take you back to the page to enter details of his school. However, now the 'school/college/centre name' section will not be greyed out, so you can type in there your school name. Homeschooled students should enter 'Homeschool' or 'TEACH'.

For baccalaureate-type qualifications, we recommend that applicants enter their overall baccalaureate as one qualification, and then enter the subjects that make up that baccalaureate within that qualification, in the modules section. That way it should be clear that one qualification has been completed, but that it consists of different elements. Students can then also enter one overall grade for the qualification, and individual grades for each subject if desired. This is how qualifications like the International Baccalaureate Diploma are entered, so universities should be familiar with this format.
